
## TRI-CITIES CHILD CARE NEEDS ASSESSMENT



have experienced changes in primary child care the past year

46%

respondents would change child care arrangements if a preferred option became available.

49%

need full-time child care five days/per week for their children younger than school age

54%

need out of school care five days/week for school aged children
